Cane Pace Champion Dynamic Youth Could Be Supplemented Into Little Brown Jug

Although he is not eligible to the Little Brown Jug, Cane Pace winner Dynamic Youth could be supplemented into the Delaware, Ohio Classic. Dynamic Youth went off at odds of 2/5 in the wagering as part of the Jerry Silva Stable entry with A Rocknroll Dance.

Dynamic Youth battled Pet Rock through the stretch to win by a nose. Bettor's Edge finished third and A Rocknroll Dance fourth. Dynamic Youth's victory in 1:48.4 was a track record for a three-year-old pacing gelding at Tioga Downs.

Although primarily a New York Sires Stakes competitor, in his last start Dynamic Youth finished second in the Confederation Cup. The son of Bettor's Delight has won five of 13 starts and \$396,000. He was driven by George Brennan and is trained by Aaron Lambert.

The Cane Pace is the first jewel in Pacing's Triple Crown and the Little Brown Jug is the second leg and will be raced September 20 at the Delaware, Ohio Fairgrounds.

Jug Hopefuls Dapper Dude and Bolt The Door Win

Dapper Dude, a stablemate of North America Cup winner Thinking Out Loud, captured the \$200,000 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes Championship Sunday by 3 ½ lengths over Sweet Lou and Bakin On The Beach at Pocono Downs. Dapper Dude, trained by Robert McIntosh, won in 1:49.

Adios Pace champion Bolt The Duer scored a 1:49.1 victory in Saturday's \$30,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes at Lexington's Red Mile. With Mark MacDonald in the sulky, Bolt The Duer defeated Caviart Key by 3 ¼ lengths. Bolt The Duer and Thinking Out loud will meet in Sunday's \$200,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes Final at The Red Mile.

Jugette contender Economy Terror won the \$200,000 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes 3YO Filly Pace in 1:49 at Pocono Downs. The \$350,000-est. Jugette will be raced September 19.
