

## **Showherthemoney Wins \$350,000 Jugette**

Showherthemoney and Jim Morrill, Jr. overcame a misstep in the elimination to capture the \$350,000 Jugette in straight heats on Wednesday at the Delaware County Fair.

At the start of the \$168,000 second heat, Dave Palone rushed Ginger And Fred off the rail to take early command. Showherthemoney was placed third behind stablemate Kabbalah Karen B (Mark MacDonald). Morrill sent the eventual winner after the leader and took control just past the quarter in :27 3/5. John Campbell moved Kiss Me Kate up to challenge at the half in :56 2/5 and three-quarters in 1:25. Showherthemoney sprinted home in :28 to score the 1 length victory. The pocket-sitting Ginger And Fred shook loose late to secure the second spot. Kiss Me Kate was another 2 1/4 lengths back in third.

The Real Artist lass is trained by Tracy Brainard for the Bulletproof Enterprises of Boca Raton, FL.

"She was amazing today," noted the soft spoken trainer who scored her first Jugette title.

As the gates wings folded for the second elimination, the 1-9 favorite Showmethemoney made a break in stride and spotted the field a 10 length advantage. Warrawee Kay (Ron Pierce) took advantage of the miscue and led the field through the first three-quarters of a mile in 1:24 2/5. Morrill sent Show Me The Money three wide into the final turn and nipped Kiss Me Kate by a head in 1:53 2/5.

"We'll make some equipment changes," noted Morrill after the elimination. "I still have confidence in her...she's a tough filly."

In the first elimination, Ginger And Fred took the lead just past the quarter pole in :26 2/5 and never looked back winning in 1:53 3/5. Special Sweetheart (David Miller) was 1 1/4 lengths back in second. Kabbalah Karen B and West Of LA (John Campbell) advanced to the final.

Bulletproof Enterprises will look to sweep Delaware's top paces when they send out three colts in tomorrow's Little Brown Jug, Straight Shooting, If I Can Dream and Vertical Horizon.

## **Colby D upsets in OBC for 3-year-old Colt Trot**

Dave Palone guided Colby D to a 1 1/4 length upset victory over Master's Cook (David Miller) in the first division of the \$47,634 (div) Ohio Breeders Championship for sophomore colt trotters.

Colby D, who paid \$35.00 to win, rallied from fifth at the 3/4 mile pole to collar the field in 1:59 4/5. The son of Emile Angus Colby D is conditioned by Jim Dailey for Keith Ross or Bellefontaine, OH.

The second division was won by V Squared and Scott Zeron. The son of Pegasus Spur used the rail and went gate to wire in 1:58 4/5. V Squared's victory was his fifth straight and the tenth of his season. He is owned by Scott A. Robinson of Cleveland, OH.

### **Trick Man and Doc's Yankee Take 2CP OBC**

Trick Man and Ray Paver overcame his outside post and scored a 1:57 3/5 victory over EJ's Pocket Rocket (Tyler Smith) in the first division of the OBC two-year-colt pace.

Trick Man left from post 8 and improved to third at the quarter mile pole. Paver took command of the field before the half mile station. Trick Man set the remaining fractions and cruised to a 1 length victory.

The reigning Ohio Sire Stakes champion is owned by Knox Services, Inc. of Mt. Vernon, OH.

In the second \$31,617 Division, Doc's Yankee and Kyle Ater defeated Show Me Glory (Time Tetrack) by a half length. The final time of 1:55 3/5 was just a 1/5 off the national season's record. The Yankee Cruiser gelding is owned by the Bay Racing Stable of Delaware, OH and conditioned by Ron Potter.

### **Youth Movement in the Driver's Standings**

Youth is being served so far in the driver's standings of the Delaware County Fair. Through the first four days of action, Dan Noble, the 26-year-old son of Ohio Hall of Fame driver Sam Noble III, and Aaron Merriman (31 years-old) are tied atop the standings with 7 victories. Ryan Stahl (31) and Matt Kakaley (21) are tied for second with 6 victories each.

Other notable young victors include, Tyler Smith (16) and Scott Zeron (20).
